CÓNAL CREEDON | WRITER

Cónal Creedon is a short story writer, novelist, playwright, and documentary filmmaker. His stage plays include: *The Trial Of Jesus* (2000), produced as part of the Irish National Millennium Celebrations (awarded two National Business2Arts Awards and nominated for The Irish Times Theatre Awards), *Glory Be To The Father* (2002), and *Second City Trilogy* (2005), commissioned by The European Capital of Culture.

In 2008, Creedon's play, *When I Was God*, was produced by Plays Upstairs New York at the *1st Irish New York Theatre Festival*. In 2009 his plays *When I Was God* and *After Luke* were produced by the Irish Repertory Theatre in New York to high critical acclaim. In 2010 two of Cónal's plays, *When I Was God* and *After Luke* represented Ireland to high acclaim at the World Expo in Shanghai, China. *The Cure* had its New York premiere in 2013, when it featured at the Origin New York Theatre Festival. The Production went on to be awarded Best Actor and nominated Best Playwright Award.



AL DALTON | DIRECTOR

Al is a freelance director and production manager. Previous production and direction credits include works with; Cork Opera House, Graffiti Theatre Company, CIT Cork School of Music, Cork Midsummer Festival, Conflicted Theatre Co., Corcadorca Theatre Company, Bombinate Theatre, Gaitkrash Theatre Company, Lantern Productions, Farna Theatre Company, CIT Musical Society, Strive Theatre and the Urdang Academy of Musical Theatre (London). He participated on the Fishamble The New Play Company Directing Mentorship Programme in association with Belltable:Connect facilitated by Jim Culleton, Gavin Kostick & Marketa Dowling (2016-2017).

Al is also co-artistic director of ALSA Productions, a Cork based company who collaborate with artists from a variety of disciplines and art forms.



SADHBH BARRETT COAKLEY | DIRECTOR

Sadhbh is a free-lance producer, stage manager and actor. She holds a BA in Theatre and Drama Studies from CIT Cork School of Music. She completed the Smock Alley Creative Producers GENERATOR training programme 2016/2017 and is currently studying an MA in Arts Management and Creative Producing in UCC.

Sadhbh is co-artistic director of ALSA Productions. ALSA Productions were artists in

residence in CIT Cork School of Music (2017-2019) and Artists in Residence in Corcadorca's Theatre Development Centre (2018 - present).

With ALSA Productions, Sadhbh has produced *Swim/Stroke* at Clonmel Junction Festival and Cork Midsummer Festival and *Tall Tail* at Cork Midsummer Festival 2019 and Graffiti Theatre and The Everyman Cork 2019. Freelance producing credits include *This Girl Laughs...* by Graffiti Theatre Co. and *Blackwater Babble* by BrokenCrown.

Her recent stage managing credits include; *Contact* (Corcadorca), *The O'Casey Project* (Shinawil Productions), *The Big Chapel X* (Asylum Theatre & Kilkenny Arts Festival), *Seahorse* (Dublin Fringe & Everyman Cork), *What Good Is Looking Well...* (Dublin Fringe & Irish Tour), *How It Is* (Gare St Lazare, The Everyman & Coronet Notting Hill), *Here All Night* (Gare St Lazare, Irish Tour), *My Real Life* (Ed Fringe 17, Irish Tour), *Eggsistentialism* (Ed Fringe 17) and *Noël* (National Opera House).

ALSA PRODUCTIONS

ALSA Productions is a Cork-based theatre company who make work for all ages. Founders Sadhbh Barrett Coakley and Al Dalton, graduates of the BA Theatre and Drama Studies at CIT Cork School of Music (CITCSM), also freelance in various other roles. Al as a director, actor and production manager and Sadhbh as a producer, stage manager and actor.

ALSA Productions are currently Artist in Residence in Corcadorca's Theatre Development Centre and were Artists in Residence in CITCSM 2017 - 2020. They also participated on Gare St. Lazare Ireland's artist mentorship programme 2017-2018 in association with The Everyman and on the MAKE residency in 2018 in the Tyrone Guthrie Centre. Their most recent production *Tall Tail*, in association with Graffiti Theatre Co, premiered at Cork Midsummer Festival 2019.



GARY MURPHY

Gary has performed on The Everyman stage on many occasions, most recently as part of the Play It By Ear programme. He played the role of Father Jack in The Everyman production of Brian Friel's *Dancing at Lughnasa* and in the Broken Crow production of *Blackwater Babble*.

He has performed over the years on all the Dublin stages as well as in the UK and the US. He has many film roles to his credit and has appeared on TV shows that include *The Tudors*, *Vikings*, *Moone Boy*, *Love/Hate*, *Ripper Street*, *Klondike* and *The Young Offenders*.

He is a regular reader for RTE Radio's "Book on One".



ÉANNA HARDWICKE

Eanna is a graduate of the Lir Academy, Trinity College Dublin. While at The Lir, credits include Simon in *Caucasian Chalk Circle*, directed by Tom Creed; Fritz in *Dalliance*, directed by Hilary Wood; and Nat in *The Ash Fire*, directed by Maisie Lee. Eanna can be seen in the leading role of 'The Boy' in *Vivarium*, directed by Lorcan Finnegan, which premiered in Critic's Week in Cannes, and was released in March this year. He can also be seen in the hugely popular *Normal People* (BBC/Hulu/RTE), playing Rob, directed by Lenny Abrahamson and Hettie MacDonald. He was filming *Smother* (BBC Studios/RTE) in

County Clare earlier this year, due to resume with the lifting of Covid-19 restrictions. Previous theatre credits include: *The Misfit Mythology* (Mighty Oak Productions - Cork Arts Theatre), *The Ballad of Reading Gaol* (Mouth on Fire); *Macbeth* (The Mill Theatre); *Gulliver's Travels* with the National Youth Theatre, directed by Conall Morrison; *Woyzeck* with Corcadorca, directed by Pat Kiernan.

Film/TV: *The Eclipse*, directed by Conor McPherson. *Krypton: Series 2*, directed by Metin Huseyin.



TOMMY HARRIS

Tommy most recently recorded the voice of Donal in *Nora Webster*, the BBC Radio 4 version of Colm Tóibín's novel, adapted by Adrian Hodges and directed by Allegra McLroy.

On stage he most recently played the role of Eddie in *Drama at Inish* directed by Cal McCrystal for the Abbey Theatre. Tommy played the role of Seánie Duggan alongside Brian Gleeson in *Resistance* directed by Catherine Morshead, and prior to that the part of Micke in *Let the Right One In* directed by John Tiffany at the National Theatre of Ireland. Further credit include the original *Young Offenders* movie with Chris Walley and Alex Murphy, directed by Peter Foott.

Tommy trained at the Cork School of Music, and holds a BA in Theatre and Drama Studies.
