

# A NOTE FROM THE WRITER KARAN CASEY

Agnes Ryan of the hotel was my great grandmother. In 2016 I was invited by my granduncle Jacko to sing at the unveiling of a plaque for her husband, Pakie Ryan of the hotel. He was the head centre of the Irish Republican Brotherhood, and ran operations in Doon Co. Limerick. He went on the run and was imprisoned in Wormwood Scrubs, London, where he went on hunger strike. While I have found a lot of information about Pakie, very little was known about Agnes. Whenever I asked a question about her, an apparition would materialise in the room. She was an O'Dwyer from Hibernia House in Doon and her mother was a seamstress from Belmullet in Co. Mayo. Like many Irish people, I became fascinated with the time period, particularly with the women activists who were involved.

There is some familial lore about Agnes and her 12 children, some of which I have substantiated and some not.

All this led me to learn about other women from the period, particularly some artists who were involved in the suffragette movement and came from different backgrounds. Women such as Kathleen Clarke and Countess Markievicz came to the fore. The woman whose head rose up from the past was an Cailleach – the legendary folk figure who has been overseeing all. I ended up writing a lot of songs and poems which I am now delighted to showcase at The Everyman in The Women, We Will Rise, produced by Aoife Clarke and directed by Tom Creed. I am thrilled to give voice to these gallant women.



# WRITER & PERFORMER



### KARAN CASEY VOCALS & PIANO

Irish singer-songwriter Karan Casey has been blazing a trail in folk music for over 30 years. A lover of ballads, love songs and searing social justice songs – she has toured the world, connecting with audiences via the stories of Ireland's past, whilst crucially repositioning women and songs in a universal and modern setting.

Always fond of a good yarn, Karan is striking out – exploring new areas in spoken word and theatre, as well as performing on the piano.

She has released eleven albums – and has toured extensively throughout North America, Europe and Japan, performing with her own band as well as collaborating with diverse musicians such as Maura O'Connell, James Taylor, Bela Fleck,

Boston Pops Orchestra, Kate Ellis, Niall Vallely, Pauline Scanlon, The Chieftains, The Dubliners, Peggy Seeger, Karen Matheson, Mick Flannery, Mícheál Ó Súilleabháin, Tim O'Brien and Solas.
In 2018, Karan helped found FairPlé, an organisation aimed at achieving fairness and gender balance for female performers in Irish traditional and folk music.
Karan tours with her band Niamh Dunne, Sean Óg Graham and Niall

Vallely.

Hieroglyphs That Tell the Tale, produced by Donald Shaw, was released on Vertical Records in 2018. In 2019 she achieved a PhD in music at the University of Limerick, and her song 'Down in the Glen' was nominated for Best Original Folk Song at the RTÉ Folk Awards. Karan's first theatre show I Walked into My Head, directed by Sophie Motley, was premiered at the Kilkenny Arts Festival 2021. 2022 saw Karan collaborate with composer Harry Escott on a version of the Irish ballad 'Grace' for the film Ali & Ava.

Karan's new album *Nine Apples of Gold* was released to great critical acclaim in February 2023. It has received extensive radio play on both sides of the Atlantic reaching No 1 on the US Folk radio charts.

# **PERFORMERS**



### NIAMH DUNNE FIDDLE & VOCALS

Niamh Dunne is an accomplished fiddle player and singer known for her unique traditional fiddle playing, her folk-infused fiddle compositions and smoky warm vocal style. She released her first album of self-penned songs *Tides* in 2022 to critical acclaim.

Her band Beoga's album How to Tune a Fish was shortlisted for a Grammy nomination, and their profile was elevated through their writing and performances on Ed Sheeran's ÷ album. They made numerous appearances with Ed, including his headline Glastonbury performance.

Niamh is a long-standing member of The Karan Casey Band and has recorded extensively with Casey.

Niamh has vast experience as a composer and has performed her own compositions and songs with the Ulster Orchestra and with the RTÉ Concert

Orchestra in the National Concert Hall.



# **SEÁN ÓG GRAHAM** GUITAR

Seán Óg Graham has recorded 7 albums as a founding member of Beoga and has toured worldwide. Wall Street Journal describes Beoga as "... the most exciting band to come out of Ireland this century". Beoga recently performed on Ed Sheeran's latest album + and Seán Óg's own composition 'Minute 5' was instrumental in providing the musical backdrop to the global hit 'Galway Girl', which has been streamed over 800 million times on Spotify. Seán Óg is regarded as one of Ireland's top button accordion players and has composed a vast number of tunes. His wealth of experience in the recording studio has led to an increased demand in recent years for his engineering and production roles.

Seán Óg has also performed with Lúnasa, Liz Carroll, Karan Casey, Maura O'Connell, Flook, Natalie Merchant, Mairtín O'Conor Band, Duke Special and many others.

# TOM CREED DIRECTOR

Tom Creed is one of Ireland's leading opera and theatre directors, and his productions have been seen at all the major Irish theatres and festivals and internationally in over 30 cities on 3 continents. He was previously Festival Director of Cork Midsummer Festival, Theatre and Dance Curator of Kilkenny Arts Festival and Associate Director of Rough Magic. He is a member of the **Expert Advisory Committee of Culture** Ireland, chair of GAZE Film Festival, a board member of Theatre Forum, and was a member of the steering committee of the National Campaign for the Arts 2016-2022. He recently completed an MFA in Art in the Contemporary World at NCAD, and is Curator for Ireland's representation at the 2023 Prague Quadrennial. Upcoming productions include The Quare Fellow (Abbey Theatre) and The President (Gate Theatre and Sydney Theatre Company).



# SINÉAD WALLACE LIGHTING DESIGNER

Sinéad Wallace is resident Lighting
Designer at The Lir Academy leading
the Lighting Design module on the
Masters in Stage Design.
Sinéad works as a lighting designer for

theatre, opera and dance throughout Ireland. She has received Irish Times Theatre Awards for 'Best Lighting' three times between 2007 and 2010.

Sinéad's recent lighting designs include Tartuffe and iGirl (Abbey Theatre); Bajazet, The Lighthouse and Least Like the Other (Irish National Opera) and In Middletown (Gate Theatre).

She has worked extensively for the Abbey Theatre, Corn Exchange and Irish National Opera, as well as for the Gate Theatre, Liz Roche Company and The Emergency Room.

Sinéad is particularly interested in sustainable theatre making and has been involved in drafting The Lir's Sustainablity Policy and Action Plan.

# NIALL VALLELY SOUND & VIDEO DESIGNER

One of Ireland's most significant musicians and composers, Niall Vallely has toured the world and recorded with the likes of Nomos, Buille, Paddy Keenan, Tim O'Brien and Jazz legend Cassandra Wilson. His tune compositions have been recorded on more than 80 albums.

In more recent years, he has been expanding the scope of his compositions to embrace larger scale forms and instrumentation, involving musicians from the worlds of traditional and classical musics.

He has had numerous commissions, including from RTÉ Lyric FM, BBC, TG4, Cork Opera House, Crash Ensemble, Kate Ellis, Boston Pops Orchestra, RTÉ Concert Orchestra, NI Arts Council. He has collaborated with Lúnasa, Iarla Ó Lionáird, Donal Lunny, Karan Casey, Stevie Appleby and several major orchestras. In 2022, Niall was appointed Artist in Residence at the National Opera House, Wexford.



# JESSICA HEALY-RETTIG COSTUME STYLIST

Jessica Healy-Rettig has worked in professional theatre in Cork and around the country for the past 20 years as Costume Designer, Supervisor and Maker. She particularly enjoys the creative process from concept to finish and has worked on every genre of show, from contemporary dance to pantomimes, plays, musicals and opera. Recent theatre credits include Costume Designer for The Settling with BrokenCrow as part of Cork Midsummer festival, Costume Supervisor and Stylist for The Cork Proms at Cork Opera House, Costume Designer for Cinderella at The Everyman and Costume Designer for Guests of the Nation with Corcadorca Theatre Company. Jessica studied Theatre Production in Cork, Pattern Cutting at The London College of Fashion and holds a Diploma in Image and Fashion Styling. Alongside her theatre work, Jessica also works as a personal stylist with her own business The Art of Style.
